In 2004 the Board of Regents appointed a Math Standards Committee, consisting of Math teachers and other experts statewide, to revise the math learning standards. Their recommendations, adopted by the Regents in 2005 after extensive positive public comment, called for introducing more advanced math content into the lower grades in elementary and middle school. **The 2006 Grade 4 Math tests were more difficult than tests in previous years.**

Statewide Math scores in grade 4 dropped by about 7 percentage points. **Thus, the results at C.A.S.H. are even that much more impressive.**

We look forward to continued results from our students as we continue to uphold the reputation for being one of the strongest academic programs on the North Shore.

- Level 2 – Meets some but not all the standards or partially meets the standards
- Level 1 – Shows serious academic problems
